Emily has been the recipient of numerous awards at workplace, including the prestigious 'Art Solomon memorial Award' for outstanding Indigenous employee. In 2017, she was awarded the Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of Fraser Valley. Emily's original home territory is the Ochapowace First Nation in Saskatchewan.
